65% of young people had a positive move on, whether it's a new home or life skills, learning or jobs.



YOUTH HUB

156 people were supported through the Youth Hub, their first port of call when facing homelessness. Of those 146 had a positive outcome.



YOUTH POWER

The Youth Power work means the Alliance is starting to be influenced by the young people on the Steering Group.



PEER SUPPORT

Through the RISE programme and Harry's Cafe young people supported each other. 117 Christmas packs and 82 Christmas dinners helped soften isolation and loneliness.
